Revised billing method for Member Industries of NCT of Jhagadia Industrial Estate

This method shall be applicable for the billing for the month of January 2020.

As per the proposal received from Jhagadia Industrial Estate and as approved by the Board of Directors of NCT through Circular Resolution, the billing formula and corresponding policy for Operation and Maintenance Charges are changed w.e.f. January 2020.

The copy of the policy of Operation and Maintenance Charges is attached herewith for your information, please.

Policy for Operation & Maintenance Charges (O&M Charges) w.e.f. 01/01/2020 (For Members of Jhagadia Industrial Estate)

1. The effluent of Jhagadia Industrial Estate does not under go any treatment. Hence total cost allocated by NCT for Jhagadia Industrial Estate shall be distributed to the member industries on two basis, 70% shall be distributed on the basis of quantity of effluent calculated as per point no. 2 below and 30% shall be distributed on the basis of COD load (quantity as per point no. 2 below x Avg. COD of the member of the month).

 Regarding quantity (Kilo Littre per Month or KLM), 80% valid CCA quantity or reading of flow meter, whichever is higher, will be considered for billing purpose. CCA Quantity: The quantity of total effluent (industrial and domestic) as described in

Consolidated Consent and Authorization issued by GPCB.

 For quality purpose, M/s. NCT / Third Party Monitoring Agency appointed by NCT will collect necessary samples every month (Min. 04 samples) from the industries and average of that

will be considered for the billing of that month.

4. Average COD of last three months shall be considered for the Member Industry not found discharging anything during all scheduled visits by NCT / Third Party Monitoring Agency appointed by NCT. Any COD default already established in the last three months and on which NCT has already taken action against the member industry, such defaulting COD shall not be considered for calculating the avg. COD of last three months.

5. To consider only one sample out of samples collected in a span of 72 Hours, whichever is

worst for billing purpose

6. 45 days deposit on the basis of ₹. 50 from Large / Medium Scale Industries and ₹. 30 from SSI will be taken for the new O & M deposit. New O&M Deposit means deposit calculated on the basis of CCA issued by GPCB to the new member industries and increased CCA by GPCB to the existing member industries. NCT will give 5.00 % simple interest on this deposit amount.

7. Billing will be done every month and bill will be sent on 15th of every month to Member

Industries through courier.

8. Member Industry has to pay the bill within 15 days from the bill date. If payment is made after the due date of 15 days from the bill date then late payment interest @12 % p.a.will be levied. The amount of interest will be adjusted against the subsequent payment made by the member industries.

 Member Industry not making payment as per O&M Policy and found defaulting in making payment, action against such member industry shall be taken as per prevailing Monitoring

& Control Policy of NCT as approved by NCT Board.

10. Member Industries who are having consent to discharge their effluent only in the monsoon season will have to submit the certificate from respective GIDC / NAA for disconnection of underground drainage connection for that particular period. Minimum charges as applicable to zero discharge units will be levied from such Member Industries.

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
